Rebecca Baker, KPM Auditing Firm

Ms. Baker presented this year's audit and answered questions from the board. She went over revenues, expenses, and new accounting procedures. This year's audit for fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 was presented as a clean audit by auditing standards.

Planning and Zoning:

Easement mistake from 2017 was discussed. Zimmerman has agreed to get the information to us to record the right one.

Admin Update with New and Old Business discussions

- 1. Old Zimmerman plat will be getting recorded correctly
- 2. If Board approves draft ordinance for parking a public hearing will be set

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- 3. Salt shed contractor doesn't have proper insurance and Chad will be looking into different options.
- 4. Park improvements to the score boards was discussed. A Webster Electric grant may be available and if utilized the city would still need to pay around \$5,000.00. An RFP for score boards will be done to start with.
- 5. Park Lighting and wiring looks to cost around \$33,247.00 new. Webster Electric looked at the problem and said that we would need to spend \$18,939.68 to fix the problems and then could phase the rest of the issues in as things brake.
- 6. The Slide at the park on the playground is chipped and will need to be replaced at a cost of \$3,309.00.
- 7. New PW truck, plow, crane, and salter came in at \$107,358. A dealer has approached the city with a used truck that already has a crane for \$34,000.00. Chad asked board to consider taking the crane off the new truck package that will take the price down \$12,500.00 and with the F 550 trade in, the cost of 1 new truck and 1 newer truck would total \$125,295.00.
