Steven Whitney, South Street

Mr. Whitney came before the board to discuss the 8 water leaks in 3 years, that have happen since he has lived there, the hardness of the water, low water pressure, and the contamination

that the leaks cause. The water line does need replaced and would have to be worked into the budget. It is currently a 1-inch galvanized line on a dead-end street. Mr. Whitney asked for water testing to be done in that area. The administrator did advise that testing is done and submitted to DNR twice a month from locations across town selected by DNR.

Sheila Seaton, Mooney Street

Ms. Seaton come before the board to discuss the poor taste of the water as well. It tastes like chlorine and her dog won't drink it. She also wanted to discuss Mooney Street and why would Rogersville spend money on extending Mooney Street when they have so many other projects to do.

Tommy Garrett, Bailiwick

Mr. Garrett came to discuss all the construction trucks going to fast down Bailiwick, the pot holes it is causing and dirt and debris it is leaving on the street. Kids on bikes could get hurt.

Nicole Hampton, Sawyer Creek HOA

Ms. Hampton came before the board to discuss damage to the streets and speed. She has contacted the Administrator and Police Chief and they have responded and got the builders to clean mess up and the police have pulled construction people over. Ms. Hampton has ask for speed bumps and was told no because of snow plowing. She also discussed the potential traffic this could add to Lakeside with the whole development being built out. She gave an example of 232 homes x 2 cars up to 2 times a day. Sawyer Creek residents are in favor of Mooney Street.

Sheila Seaton

Does not want to see the traffic dumped on Mooney Street. Especially the construction traffic.

Robin Gary

The influx of construction traffic has caused pot holes. The city did repair them, but they are back.

Dorene Manary, Snowbird

Ms. Manary came to thank the administrator and the board for fixing the Shores Parkway spill way. It looks great.

Melony Phillips, Mooney Street

Ms. Phillips talked of changes made to the plan for Mooney Street and why were they not informed. She asked if there would be a public hearing before the project started? She feels this is a waste of money that people will not use because it is a right in, right out street. She wanted to know why they could build a road across the rail road tracks. An extra crossing would not be allowed due to the rail road quiet zone.

Sheila Seaton, Mooney Street

Ms. Seaton wanted to follow up on what Ms. Phillips was asking about not being told of changes. Alderman Clarkson said that the project has not been awarded or voted on and the board is still trying to get more information before any decision is made. Alderman Clarkson also spoke of

Alderman Pyle and Alderman Lee agree that they are not attractive to look at but don't want to restrict people from having them. Alderman Stucki was not against but would like painted one color. Alderman Clarkson was not opposed to the storage containers as portable buildings. A public hearing will be set.
